


In the United States there are **14,824,878** children in potential need of child care. Unfortunately, there are only **10,833,062** available child care slots within a reasonable driving distance, resulting in a gap of **4.2 million**.

The gap costs the U.S. economy billions

For every child care slot parents need but cannot access, the economy loses between \$52,000 and \$79,000 each year, stemming from reduced workforce participation, lower productivity, decreased household earnings, impact on business earnings, and tax losses.
